The mission of the Community Asylum Seekers Project is to cultivate a supportive community for those seeking asylum in the U.S., while offering basic needs and accompanying them on their journey towards building a life in this country.

ASYLUM SEEKERS

are people who flee their country of residence, enter another country, and apply for refuge. An asylum seeker is an immigrant who has been forcibly displaced and might have fled their home country because of war, gender violence, or other factors harming them or their family.



WE CURRENTLY SUPPORT

seventeen asylum seeking adults and children from Latin America, the Caribbean, and East and West Africa. They attend local schools and houses of worship, staff local businesses, volunteer at food banks, and sing in local choirs.

THE SUPPORTIVE COMMUNITY

provided by our staff and volunteers includes neighborhood orientation, language learning, social support, legal aid, medical and mental health care, connections to community services, school enrollment, job training and placement, and any other needs that arise!
